## HERE ARE SOME OTHER THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND:



Your moving company should always do a visual survey of your household goods. That can be in-person or virtual using your smart phone. Either way, it's a must.

Ask your salesperson about Full
Replacement Value Protection (FRVP)
— this is the agreement with the van line as


— this is the agre to how much your household goods are worth and what will happen if items are damaged during the move. Moving without FRVP coverage means your household goods are only worth 60 cents per pound, per item.

Your expensive television that

weighs only 30 pounds would



be worth less than \$20. Yes, FRVP will cost more, but it's worth the peace of mind. Make sure your salesperson explains FRVP — and if a company doesn't offer it, walk away.
